

# Message

Community Based Medical College Hospital is a 650 bedded academic modern hospital having a floor space around 4,00,000 square feet, average bed occupancy around 85%. Almost all health care facilities are available under a same roof. It has started functioning on 1st February, 1997. Very recently we have added another new wide spacious building in our hospital, which has started functioning in 1st November 2020.

Hospital has seven well equipped operation theaters, 79 well qualified & experienced consultants, 87 mid level doctors are giving their service round the clock. At present 138 Intern doctors taking training in this hospital. We have around 123 staff nurses providing best possible care to the patients. Student nurses of Community Based Nursing Institute are taking training in our hospital.

#### Establishment

The Community Health Foundation Bangladesh was established at Mymensingh in the year of 1994 by thirty eminent philanthropic persons of different profession and position under the leadership of late Professor Dr. AlM Mafakhkharul Islam.

#### Governance

The Foundation has been registered under the Societies Registration Act. XXI of 1860 (being an Act for the registration of literacy, Scientific of charitable societies) in the registrar of Joint Stock Companies, Bangladesh and governed by its article of memorandum

The Executive Body of Foundation consisting of not more than 30 (thirty) persons is composed of one Executive President, Two Executive Vice-Presidents, one Tressurer and Twenty six members.

- To conduct refresher courses in Medicine for General Practitioners subject to the approval of the Government as required under sec 31(1) of the Medical & Dental Act 1980.
- To organise conferences, lectures and seminars and set up study groups and training programmes for furtherance of the standard of medical knowledge in the country.
- To undertake and provide publication of journal or journals and of research papers and of books and brochures with a view to furtherance of medical knowledge in the country.
- To invite as and when feasible scholars National and/ or International to avail of the facilities offered by the Foundation and / or to benefit the Foundation by their knowledge and experience.
- To institute, confer and grant fellowships, awards, prizes, scholarships and stipends for higher studies and research work in medicine and allied subject in the country or abroad.
- To acquire land on purchase from the members of the public or otherwise own possess or take on lease or hire property necessary or convenient for the furtherance of the objectives of the Foundation.
- To contribute modestly within the parameter of Health and Science the overall national efforts in achieving a meaningful, Selfsustain quality of life and environment.

# College Profile

# Year of establishment :

Established as an academic enterprise of Community Health Foundation Bangladesh in 1995.

#### Location:

At Winnerpar on a panoramic 22 Acres land 10 km from Mymensingh town towards Dhaka, on the east side of Mymensingh-Dhaka highway.

## Infrastructural facilities :

The academic and administrative facilities of the college are provided in its own constructed four storied building with one lac twenty thousand square feet floor space.

Hospital facilities are housed in a three storied building having one lack five thousand square feet. Another Building annex to main hospital building with one lac & seventy four thousand square feet floor space is under construction. The hospital building has a provision for 650 beds covering all disciplines as required for an undergraduate medical institution. Construction work for extension of hospital building is under way.

Besides these 416 beds capacity three storied Boys Hostel and 323 beds capacity Ladies Hostel are situated in the same campus. A beautiful four storied dormitory is presently used by the inservice trainee doctors.

By road from Capital City of Dhaka (2 hours drive) and Mymensingh town by institutional transport and also easily available public transport.

# Course and Curriculum:

The five-year MBBS course offered by the Faculty of Medicine of Dhaka University is followed as per curriculum as approved by Bangladesh Medical and Dental Council, followed by one-year compulsory internship in CBMCHB or any other approved hospital.

# Academic Year : May-November.

# Academic milestones :

- a) Community Based Medical College Bangladesh is duly recognised by Bangladesh Medical & Dental Council, Government of Bangladesh and affiliated with the Dhaka University since its establishment.
- b) College is recognised by Bangladesh College of Physicians & Surgeons (BCPS) for training of the doctors in the departments of Medicine, Surgery, Obstetrics-Gynaecology, Paediatrics, Dermatology, Otolaryngology & Head neck Surgery.
- c) The Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of Bangladesh and WHO have endorsed the inclusion of Community Based Medical College Bangladesh in the World Directory of Medical Institutions.

- d) Community Based Medical College Bangladesh is an affiliated member of an international organization named "NETWORK: Towards Unity For Health (TUFH)" based at Maastrict, Netherlands.
- Total number of graduates 2001, male 1131, female 870. Total number of students on study 742, male 352 female 390. Foreign students 272, male 150, female 122 Countries : Jammu & Kashmir, West Bengal, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Andrapradesh, Bihar, Tamil Nadu of India, New Delhi, Chennal, Kerala, Nepal, USA, Australia etc.
- Two separate Committees, comprising the teachers of the college and headed by the Principal, namely Journal Committee and Research committee work for publication of a Medical Journal (Community Based Medical College Bangladesh Journal) and to undertake research works in different Medical disciplines respectively.

# College Administration:

- The sponsors of the College, namely Community Health Foundation Bangladesh is responsible for providing financial support/resources, appointment of teachers and personnel and overall administrative control of the college and the attached hospital.
- b) The academic programmes and activities are administered by the Principal of the college. Besides, an Academic Staff Council headed by the Principal is endowed with the overall responsibility for planning, developing, implementing, evaluating and amending all academic activities of the College.
- c) A Governing Body, comprising representatives from the Dhaka University, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of Bangladesh, teachers of Community Based Medical College Bangladesh, guardians of admitted students and sponsors of the college (Community Health Foundation Bangladesh) is responsible for approving the appointment of teachers & their promotion and overseeing the academic standard, implementation and evaluation of programmes of academic development and achievements.

# Co-curricular activities for students:

A Student Welfare committee with teachers as advisers supervise the co-curricular activities like cultural functions, drama, games, sports and annual Cultural & Sports week, Milad and Saraswati puza etc.

# Teaching Hospital and Field Practice:

- a) A hospital with provision for 650 beds within the campus is available for clinical practice and learning of students from the third academic year. Besides, each student is assigned with clinical responsibility of health education and healthcare for one or more families in the rural areas nearby the college. Under this community based medical education programme a village represents as community ward and a family represents a community bed.
- b) Training at Satellite Clinics: Internees doctors are required to spend specified time, to gain practical academic experience at Community level, in our satellite clinic of CBMCB at Rouha, Netrokona.

#### Hostel Accommodation :

All students required to stay in the hostels within the college campus on payment for their lodging and food charges.

# Library facilities :

A library of good standard with internet facilities is available for the students.

# Common Room & Reading Room:

Separate common room & reading room facilities for male and female students and teachers are available with cooling facilities.

# Teachers-Students Forum:

At the beginning of each session a teacher-student forum shall be formed by the Academic Council. This forum shall meet at least once in every 3 months to discuss academic affairs.

The students of first batch graduated in 2000. So far in Twenty seven successive academic sessions a total of Two thousand one (2001) students have been graduated from this college by November, 2020, including 202 foreign students.

As per rules of Bangladesh Medical and Dental council all students on passing the Final MBBS Examination shall be required to undergo one year internship in approved hospital as a prerequisite for full registration by the Council. Internship training in this institution (CBMCHB) is full time, residential and with a consolidated pay.

# DISCIPLINARY RULES

It is needless to emphasize that a very high degree of sense of integrity, self esteem and discipline is expected from a medical student. A medical student of today is the physician of tomorrow who will swear by the Hippocratic oath and Geneva Declaration on his professional conduct while engaging himself in the healing of the ailing mankind.

- Students must maintain discipline both inside and outside the campus.
- Students are required to wear white full sleeved apron while attending classes and ward duties in the hospital. Within the college and hospital camps they should carry the identify card.
- Female students shall wear light colored salwar & kamiz with preferred shoes with full sleeved apron.
- Fashionable dresses, shabby and untidy appearance are to be avoided. Prescribed dress includes white shirt, navy blue trouser, black shoes/white keds and white full sleeved apron for male students.
- Smoking, being considered as an unhealthy habit, is strictly forbidden in this Institutional campus which includes college, hospital, canteen and hostels.
- Raising of slogans, shouting, parading in processions within the institutional campus are strictly forbidden and shall be dealt with severe punitive measures.
- Pasting of posters and writing on the walls of the college, hospital and hostel premises shall be deemed as serious acts of indiscipline on the part of students responsible for it and they shall be dealt with accordingly.
- Abstentions from classes in groups or collectively without prior permission or valid reasons shall be considered as acts of indiscipline which shall be punishable with imposition of fine and other forms of punishment. Guardians shall also be informed of such activities of their wards.
- Students are expected to behave well with the staff of the college and hospital.
- Addictions to drugs and alcohol tantamount to moral turpitude and such offenders are liable to expulsion from the college.
- Political activities shall not be encouraged in the college.
- At the time of admission both the student and his/her guardian shall furnish a bond to the effects that the student shall abide by rules and regulations of the college, hospital and hostel.
- A high powered disciplinary committee is existing which is endowed with the responsibility to deal with and take necessary actions in relation to any report or charge of indisciplinary act brought against any student of the college.




